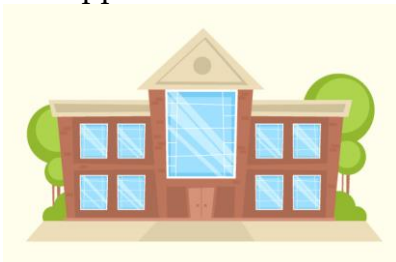
### *Time is flying!*

#### **HARVEST CHARITY COLLECTION**

## FAMILY LEARNING

## HEALTHY CHOICES

As part of our work to be a healthier school we are working hard with the children to help them make healthier choices.

In the summer we had the 'Daily Mile' track installed around the school field and Year 3 have taken on doing a daily run/walk with great enthusiasm! Research says children today are spending less time outside than the generations before them, but we know exercising outdoors has really positive benefits for both body and mind which is why we really support the idea of Daily Mile. It was launched with the rest of the school just before half term so hopefully this is an initiative that everyone will soon be involved in.



As well as exercise we encourage children to make healthy food choices too. Break time snacks can be fruit, toast or milk and school dinners are chosen that offer balanced nutrition. Some children prefer to bring a packed lunch to school, so we are also focusing on **healthy lunchboxes** to help make sure children are getting a meal that gives them energy and helps them grow.
