## The Great Explorers

This term in Year 1 we would be learning about 'The Great Explorers' Mrs Khalid and Miss Marsden are hoping you are all staying safe and well! Here is some information that you might need to know!

Throughout history people have always wondered what was beyond the next mountain, ocean, river, or even planet. Explorers are people who have made journeys into the unknown to learn about and make records of new places.

#### Why do People Explore?

Most explorers like the adventure of going to a new place, meeting new people and cultures, or taking on new challenges. People are curious to find out all about the world. They wanted to know where foods and spices could be found.

Trade - Many countries and rulers offered money to explorers in order to find new trade partners and goods. In some cases they hoped to find new trade routes that would help them to transport goods cheaper than their competitors. This was the case of Vasco da Gama and Christopher Columbus.

Gold - Often explorers have been in search of riches and treasure.

<u>Science</u> - Explorers are scientists hoping to learn about nature and new parts of the world. They may be hoping to find a new species of animal or type of plant.

Land - Many explorers claimed the land they found in the name of their country. Countries like Spain, Portugal, and Great Britain gained huge empires during the Age of Exploration.

#### The Great Explorer: Christopher Columbus

Christopher Columbus was born in Ganoa, Italy in 1451. He learned how to make maps and navigate ship. He was an explorer who discovered America. The Spanish King and Queen offered Christopher Columbus money to buy three ships called; Santa Maria, Pinta and Nina. He started his voyage on August 3<sup>rd</sup> 1492. He sailed from Europe to America with his sailors across the Atlantic Ocean, not knowing where they would land. He had a dream to travel west and go to India and China and find the route to these places. The journey was long and difficult. On October 12, 1492 land was spotted. It was a small island in the Bahamas that Columbus would name San Salvador.
