STAYING SAFE AT DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

Thank you to everyone for following our systems in the morning and afternoon. With so many people coming onto the playground at the same time it is so important we work together on this.

A few reminders about this:

- Parents must not enter the school building anywhere other than the school office. Please also make sure that children only enter their own classroom and do not go into the classrooms of their brothers and sisters
