	Could paint on a metal (old card door etc.) or careful placement of small images (inside and outside school building) like Keith Haring drew around New York streets. Practice using chalk around school form small drawings in unusual but appropriate places. Could be something that looks boring and needs brightening up or adding humour/encouragement. Pop Art Huge collaborative painting of figures of people/animals in Haring style – on tarpaulin or fabric like muslin or on huge pieces of card and could cut them out and place around school on walls climbing up and on to ceilings.
